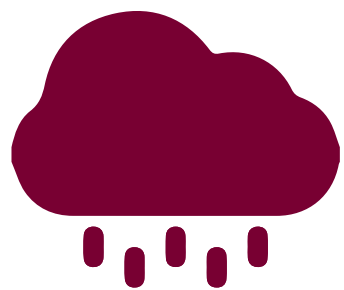

Student Orientation

In 2020/21, **3,323 students** claimed badges through the Orientation program, and **862 students** claimed badges in the Re-Orientation program – together claiming **over 26,000 badges!!**

To increase the likelihood of student success in an online environment, we developed the **Future Ready Toolkit** and **Future Ready Orientation & Re-Orientation** programs. These initiatives offer programming for new and returning students that support the transition to the upcoming semester and the added transition to virtual and remote learning.

An innovative online program called **Keys to Success** saw tremendous increases in student participation – from 115 students in F19 to **6,700+** students in F20.

The Learning Support Centre offers peer-based, academic support services in an online format. Services include course tutoring, math support, study skills, communications (including writing support), essay help, speaking help, grammar help and presentation help. Career Services offers a variety of services to students and recent grads including career advising support, resume/cover letter/e-portfolio support, interview preparation, career and networking workshops and webinars, and online career learning modules that leverage real-world simulation and Artificial Intelligence. mohawkcollege.ca/employment

The Future Ready Premium Program (FRPP) Student Micro-Certificate provides students with online modules that illustrate how to take the skills and knowledge students have gathered throughout their time at Mohawk, and how to present them to their future employer. Upon completion of the 5 online modules, students receive a micro-certificate and will gain access to job search advising after graduation.

Academic Advising & Student Success



Our Student Success Advisors provide students with specific advice on program planning, changing programs, academic status, program pathways, success plans and more.

Advisors experience between **300** and **700** student requests on a weekly basis. In December 2020 alone, **2,245** unique students used a new contact form to access streamlined support.

Student Life

Student Life fosters meaningful relationships and personal development by providing students with intentional experiences and services in a fun, inclusive learning environment.

Testing Centre

The Testing Centre facilitates in-person and virtual academic testing for students requiring testing accommodation or those unable to write with their class for valid reasons. The Testing Centre also helps incoming students prepare for college by providing Assessments for Success. The shift to virtual pre-admission testing has resulted in testing that is now available to both domestic and international applicants.

Graduation



Mohawk's graduation rate is **65.2%**, which ranks us third amongst GTHA colleges. We had a total of **4,893 graduates** in Spring 2021, which is up **13%** from Spring 2020.

Alumni

Alumni Relations cultivates lifelong relationships with students, graduates and the Mohawk community, establishing a spirit of loyalty that positively impacts the success of our proud alumni. We have **134,000 engaged Mohawk alumni**, of which **970** are Golden Grads, **160** are Alumni of Distinction award recipients, and **9** are Premier's Award recipients.

Athletics & Recreation

Provides athletics and recreation programming for students. Headlined by the Mountaineers high-performance varsity program and includes intramural, extramural, recreation and fitness opportunities. Approximately **175 students** participate in varsity athletics at Mohawk each year, and in 2018/19, **7,781 students** participated in campus recreation.
